



In pursuance of the several acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of Locations or other Office titles issued from or under the proprietary government and by the Authority of the Board of Property I have this 20th day of March 1828 Surveyed the above described tract of Two hundred and eight acres and sixty four perches and allowance of six per Cent adjoining lands of Joseph M. Donalds on the south west upon a Spring running from M. Donalds to Blacklick Creek and adjoining John Hart Lydia Raquet and Archibald Louther situate in Wheatfield Township in the County of Indiana By Virtue of a warrant granted to David Smith on the 8 day of June 1773.
