



By Virtue of an Order from the Surveyor General dated the fourth Day of October 1749 in Pursuance of an Order from the Secretary dated the third Day of the Same Month Surveyed to Conrad Weiser Esq. Two Tracts of Land situate at Mahanoy One of them Containing Three hundred & nine Acres and the other Sixty Six Acres And also Three Islands in the River Susquehanna opposite thereto One of them Containing Two hundred & seventy three Acres Another Containing Two hundred & four Acres and the other Fourteen Acres Being in the whole Eight hundred Sixty Six Acres and the usual Allowance of six Acres P. Cent. for Floods &c. Surveyed the 20th 21st 23rd & 24th Days of October 1749
