



Draught of two pieces of land situate on the waters of Fishing Creek in Fishing Creek Township Columbia County, the part on the East side of the Creek containing thirty six Acres 46 perches and allowance of 6 per Cent. and the part on the west side of the Creek containing Fifty nine Acres 147 perches & allowance of 6 per Cent. Both pieces being part of a tract of 2254 Acres & allowance, called "Chew's adventure" which was surveyed the 27th & 28th days of October 1773 for Benjamin Chew Esq. in pursuance of an Order dated the 10th day of August 1769 for 5000 Acres. The middle part interferes with two older surveys, the one in the name of James Deimer, and the other in the name of Crowle & Singer, in right of John Sprugel, leaving the above pieces clear of interference and within the lines of B. Chew Esq. Resurveyed for Benjamin Chew Esq. the 20th day of June 1835 by
