



Draught of a tract of land situate on the waters of Fishing Creek in Fishing Creek Township Columbia County, Containing sixty one Acres 27 perches and allowance of 6 per Cent Being part of a tract of 2254 Acres & allowance, called "Chew's Adventure" which was Surveyed the 27th & 28th days of October 1773 for Benjamin Chew Esq^r in pursuance of an order dated the 10th day of August 1769 for 5000^{Ac}. The land included in the original survey of Chew and adjoining the above is included in a survey made for Ludwig Imler the 18th day of June 1772, and in a Survey made for Michael Krauss the same day, which leave no more than the above clear of interference.
