



By Virtue of an application dated the fourth day of Feb<sup>y</sup> 1769 (N<sup>o</sup> 16 is dated 9<sup>th</sup> Feb<sup>y</sup> 1769) N<sup>o</sup> 16 in lieu of N<sup>o</sup> 10 was surveyed the 20<sup>th</sup> day of April 1769 unto Samuel Purviance by William Scull a tract of land situate on Loyalsock Creek and on the North side of the west branch of Susquehanna River then in the County of Berks Containing three thousand Eight hundred and Eighty acres & allowance. Two thousand one hundred acres whereof as contained in the above draught (being part of the aforesaid survey remaining in Right of the said Samuel Purviance his heirs or assigns) is now separately returned agreeably to documents in my possession and remaining in my office, situate as aforesaid on the North side of the West branch of Susquehanna, including the Spring Island, in the County of Lycom<sup>g</sup> 4<sup>m</sup> 6<sup>m</sup> 1805.
