



Draft of a tract of land, situated in the townships of Scott in Wayne County and Harmony in Susquehanna County, Pa. on the Hemlock Creek, a tributary of the Starrucca Creek, emptying into the Susquehanna River at Lanesboro, containing One Hundred and ninety Acres and Twenty Perches and allowance of six per cent for roads &c. Surveyed for Frank E. Putman 28th May A.D. 1873; being a part of a larger tract of Four Hundred and One Acres and Thirty-six Perches and allowance; originally surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted to Henry Drinker Jr. dated 27th April 1792
