



In pursuance of a warrant dated the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of October 1849. Surveyed the 27<sup>th</sup> day of October 1849 unto George N. Tatham the above mentioned tract of land being part of Windmill Island situate in the River Delaware opposite the City of Philadelphia Bounded South by the Southerly line of the Canal cut through the said Island from East to West by the Camden and Philadelphia Steamboat Ferry Company (which Canal is nearly opposite Walnut Street in the City of Philadelphia) Bounded on the North by a Certain Survey made for Joseph Fox and Moses Preston of Ten Acres and ninety one perches of flats at the north end of said Island Patented to them December 30<sup>th</sup> 1831 (See patent Book H. Vol. 30 page 317) and bounded on the East and West by low water mark of the River Delaware Excepting only out of this Application a Certain lot of Two hundred feet on its westerly front, continuing of about that width and lying parallel and adjoining on the South line of the said Survey to J. Fox and M. Preston and which Excepted lot is now in the possession of the heirs or assigns of John Smith deceased Beginning at a Corner on the Northerly side of the Camden and Philadelphia Steamboat Ferry Company, at low water mark of the River Delaware, thence along low water mark of said River N 5° 44' W 17.13 P. to a Corner thence by land in possession of the heirs or assigns of John Smith dec'd S 73° E 41.22 P. to low water mark of said River on the East side of the said Island thence along low water mark S 8° 20' E 20.84 P. to a Corner on the northerly side of said Canal, thence crossing said Canal on a Course of S 81° 40' W 15.17 P. to a Point on the South side of said Canal, thence along the South side of said Canal N 71° 42' W 30.28 P. to a Corner and thence N 30° E crossing said Canal 9.5 P. to the place of Beginning Containing six acres and ninety four perches.
