To Jacob Spangler Esqr. S. G. No. 1 represented by dotted lines is the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Samuel Pryor on warrant dated the 1st day of August 1766. this tract interferes one hundred and fifty one acres with the Moses Starr survey. Samuel Pryor conveyed to Samuel Wallace who conveyed to Abel James and Henry Drinter. Abel James conveyed to Henry Drinter, who conveyed to Patrick Cassidy who devised the same to Francis Cassidy the present owner. No. 2 represents the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Patrick Cassidy on warrant dated the 12th day of November 1814. This tract interferes one acre and forty five perches with the Moses Starr survey. Patrick Cassidy devised the same to his son Francis Cassidy the present owner. No. 3 represents part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Patrick Cassidy on warrant dated the 25th day of October 1786 this tract interferes twenty seven acres & one hundred perches with the Moses Starr survey. Patrick Cassidy devised the same to Francis and Peter Cassidy who are the present owners. No. 4 represents part of a survey in the name of Edward Woods on Order No. 19 dated the 1st day of August 1766. this tract interferes eighteen acres and one hundred and forty seven perches with the Moses Starr survey. Edward Woods conveyed to Samuel Wallace who conveyed to Abel James & Henry Drinter. Abel James conveyed to Henry Drinter, whose heirs conveyed to Patrick Cassidy, who devised the same to Francis Cassidy the present owner. No. 5 represents part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for John Wareham on warrant dated the 5th day of September 1803. this interferes eighteen acres and one hundred and forty seven perches with the Moses Starr survey. John Wareham conveyed to Michael F. Simpson who conveyed to Patrick Cassidy who devised the same to Francis Cassidy the present owner. No. 6 represents the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Patrick Cassidy on warrant dated the 24th day of December 1816. this tract interferes twenty six acres and fifty five perches with the Moses Starr survey. Patrick Cassidy devised the same to Francis Cassidy the present owner. No. 7 represents part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for William Hopkins on order No. 268 dated the 1st of August 1766. this tract interferes one acre with the Moses Starr survey. William Hopkins conveyed to Saml. Wallace who conveyed to Abel James & Henry Drinter. Abel James conveyed to Henry Drinter who conveyed to Peter Stiffey & Martin Myers the present owners. No. 8 represents the draught of a survey made for William Pringle on warrant dated the 3th day of Sept'r 1789. this tract interferes three acres with the Moses Starr survey. William Pringle conveyed to Thomas Weaver the present owner.
