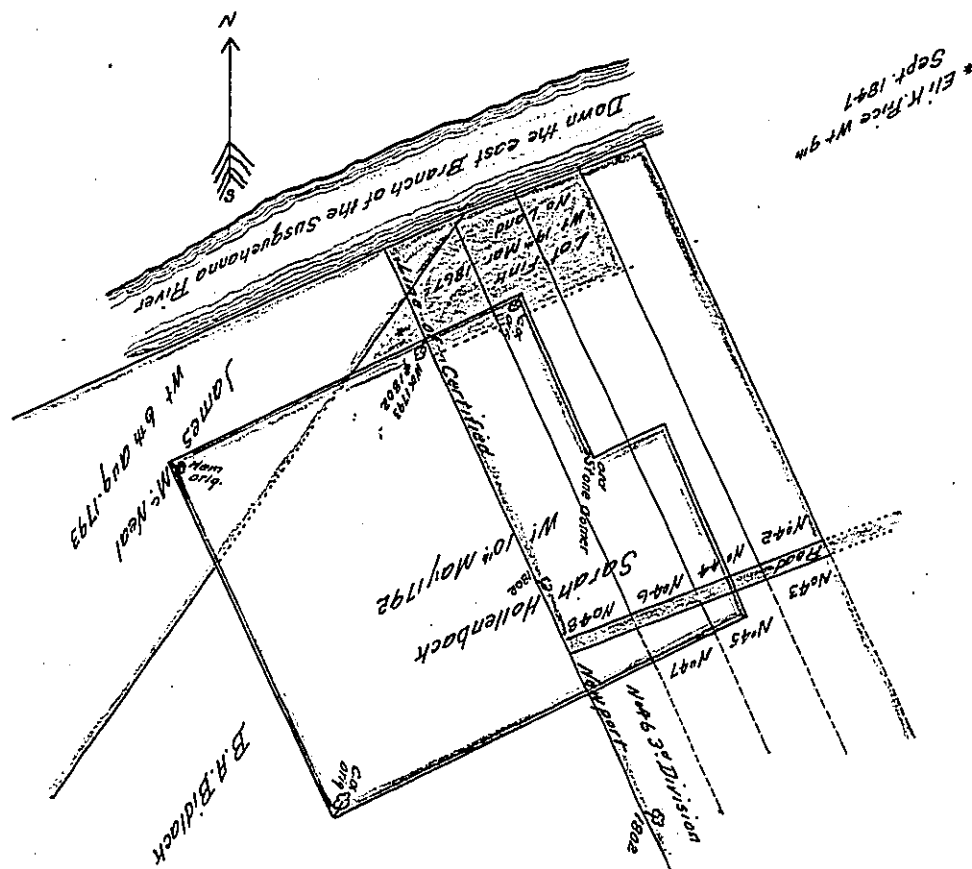


In The Matter of a Warrant dated 19th March 1867 granted to Lot Fink for 50 Acres of land in Hollenbach & Newport township Luzerne County directed to John Sturdevant Esqr then County Surveyor of Luzerne County he never having disposed of said warrant, it was placed in my hands for the purpose of locating accordingly on the 20th day of Sept 1882 ¹⁹⁰⁹ the matter a careful examination upon the ground and find the land therein described embraced within Lots Nos. 44, 46 & 48 in the 2nd Division in said Newport township a Draft of which is herewith Enclosed. The Application assumed that the Newport lots stopped on top of the mountain at or near the line of The Sarah Hollenbach tract as shown in the draft herewith Enclosed.
