



A Draught of a tract of land situate in Burn's valley Fannett township Franklin County Pa. Containing 118 acres 154 perches & allowance surveyed Jan'y 28th & March 4th, 1845 for Hugh Wallace In pursuance of a Warrant granted Sam'l Taylor bearing date Feb'y 13th, 1796. P.C. Hugh Auld D.S.

N.B. In consequence of me not knowing that Hugh Wallace was the proper owner of said land; John Smith one of the former owners admitted to the dotted line and I closed the line agreeable to Smith's admission for him and Edward Batton's heirs, but learning afterwards that Hugh Wallace had bought the land and was the proper owner, he complained that he had not all of Smith's old claim in right of Taylor, he insisted on me returning on to the ground and examining further, which I did on the 4th of March and by running into Lawrence Hochtenberry's Claim in right of Edward Batton from the Double Chest at part A I found a White oak which was marked on three sides as a corner on the near side opposite side and right hand side which I blocked and proved to be 28 years and thence I found as will appear by draught a chestnut marked on three sides as a corner; on the near side and right & left hand side which I blocked and found them all three to count 60 years the right hand side pointed towards Smith's old improvement.
