The red lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Oliver Ormsby on order No. 4348 dated the 2nd day of September 1767. This tract interferes sixty eight acres and thirty nine perches with the Jane Ormsby survey. Oliver Ormsby conveyed conveyed to Hugh Means who conveyed to Anthony Smith the present owner. No. 2 represented by bluish coulered lines is part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Robert Callender (date of survey not known). This tract interferes four acres and thirty seven perches with the Jane Ormsby survey. Robert Callender conveyed to Gerard Pendergrass, who conveyed to Gideon Fitchey, who conveyed to Anthony Smith the present owner. The dotted lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Thomas Bradshaw on warrant dated the 1st day of August 1793. This tract interferes thirty four acres and ninety seven perches with the Jane Ormsby survey. Thomas Bradshaw conveyed to John May Esqr. who devised the same to Leonard May who conveyed to Joseph Sellars the present owner. The green lines represent part of the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Matthew Taylor on warrant dated the 24th day of March 1794. This tract interferes nineteen acres and one hundred and six perches with the Jane Ormsby survey. Matthew Taylor conveyed to George Woods, who conveyed to Jno. Peebles whose Executor conveyed to Jacob Shoemaker the present owner. No. 4348. Pat'd. T. Bradshaw, not Pat'd. - M. Taylor, Pat'd.
