



Situate on the East Branch of Standing Stone Creek and near the head thereof in Barree township, Huntingdon County
Containing one hundred and thirty nine acres and one hundred and twenty five perches and allowance of six per cent. Sur-
veyed for Ludwig Lowman on order No. 1481, dated the 10th day of October, 1766. Daniel Africa, D.S.

No. 1, is part of a survey made for John Brown on warrant dated the 1st day of April, 1793. This survey interferes
thirteen acres one hundred and ten perches with the Ludwig Lowman tract. John Brown conveyed to Mathew Taylor
the present owner. No. 2 represents part of a survey made for William Lawrence on Warrant dated the 1st day of
April, 1793, this survey interferes eighty five acres and thirty one perches with the Ludwig Lowman tract. William Law-
rence conveyed to William McElevey who devised the same to the heirs of Allen Mc Elevey who are the present owners.

No. 3 represents part of a survey made for John Lardner on Warrant dated the 1st day of April, 1773. This survey
interferes forty acres and one hundred and forty four perches with the Ludwig Lowman tract. John Lardner conveyed
to William McElevey who devised the same to Allen Mc Eleveys heirs the present owners.
