



The parts marked A.B. is an interference of a Tract of 107 1/4 acres & allowice granted by Patent to Jacob Winrott dated 19th July 1808, in which Patent it is thus contained - "which said tract was surveyed in pursuance of an Application" "No. 1676, dated Oct. 27th, 1766 to Henry Bucher whose right to the same, by virtue of sundry good conveyances became" "vested in said Jacob Winrott to whom a warrant issued this day"

Part A. is now in the possession of Saml Lilly Esqre and Part B in the possession of John Marshall, Senr James Mc Barron, Matthias Martin, Saml Lilly and others.

Part C. is an interference of a tract of land owned by the heirs of Henry Lilly Dec'd & others. Patented to Thomas & Anna Lilly by Patent _____ from T. & R. Perrin dated 14th December 1768. Witness my hand August 1st, 1837.

Note _____ In a Deed, now in the possession of James Mc Barron above named, given by Thomas Eggar to Ferdinand Shultz (under whom Jacob Winrott claimed), dated the 4th day of May 1775, in reference to the above tract of 107 1/4 acres, it is thus contained - "Being the same tract of land which is partly held by a warrant for twenty five acres" "which had been granted to Adam Wichterstram, bearing date the eleventh day of June which was in the year of our Lord" "1762, and by Deed Poll bearing date the 12th day of february A.D. 1750, with covenants to procure the said warrant was" "granted * * * * * sold and assigned unto Henry Bucher, who made application to the Land Office for an Order" "sufficient to include with the said Warrant the whole of the said Tract of Land which was granted, and bearing" "date the 27th day of October 1766 and numbered 1676, in pursuance of which and said warrant the before described tract" "of land was included by metes & bounds afs'd in one survey &c"
