



Draught of a tract of land situate in Decatur township, Mifflin county which appears surveyed the 29th day of June, 1768, in pursuance of an order of survey to Mary McDonald, dated the 11th day of July, 1767, No. 4158, said to contain three hundred twenty four & $\frac{1}{2}$ acres & allow. Resurveyed the 22^d day of June, 1822 at the request of Jacob Trees the present owner, and appears to contain two hundred seventy eight acres, eleven perches & the usual allow. of six P. Cent. &c. Part of which appears included in a survey made for Elias Rager 17th August, 1793, on warrant dated 21st June, 1793, Marked No. 1. Part included in survey made for Daniel Heister Junr. 19th Aug^t. 1793 on warrant dated 9th August, 1793, Marked No. 2 & part included in survey made for Jno. Thomas 16th May 1794 on warrant dated 9th August 1793 Marked No. 3 &c. as above shown. Above interferences as ascertained & laid down for Jacob Trees the 24th day of June 1822 by draughts furnished by him which appears official &c. To Samuel Cochran Esqr. P. R. Robinson D.S.
