No 1 represented by the dotted lines, is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for James Dunlop on Order No. 3648, dated the 8th day of May 1767. this tract interferes one hundred and eleven acres with the William Lyon tract. James Dunlop devised to David Anderson the present owner

No. 2 represented by the green lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for George Wisegarver the 3th day of January 1791, on Order No. 1602 dated the 20th day of October 1766. This tract interferes twenty three acres & fifty six perches with the William Lyon tract. George Wisegarver devised it to Daniel Wisegarver the present owner
