No. 1 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Joseph Swift on Warrant dated the 19th day of April, 1766. This tract interferes eight acres and one hundred and thirty four perches with the William West survey. Joseph Swift conveyed to Nicholas Border who conveyed part to Jacob Shaver whose Widow & heirs now own the land - the residue he devised to David Border the present owner. No. 2 represented by dotted lines is a draft of A tract of land surveyed for George Woods Jr. on Warrant dated the 13th day of December 1793. This tract interferes sixty nine acres and one hundred and eight perches with the William West survey. George Woods Jr. conveyed to Anthony Smith the present owner.

No 3 represented by dotted lines is a part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Robert Callender on _____ this tract interferes sixty seven acres and ninety seven perches with the William West survey. Robert Callender conveyed to Gerhard Fendergrass who conveyed to Gideon Fitchey who conveyed to Anthony Smith the present owner

No 4 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Matthew Taylor on Warrant dated the 24th day of March, 1794. this tract interferes one acre and thirty perches with the William West Survey. Matthew Taylor conveyed to George Woods who conveyed to Henry Smith who conveyed to John Pepples whose Executor conveyed to Jacob Shoemaker the present owner.

No 5 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of A tract of land surveyed for John Friend on Warrant dated the 25th February 1785. this tract interferes six acres and one hundred and forty perches with the William West Survey. John Friend conveyed to Jacob Shoemaker the present owner.
