



In pursuance of a warrant dated the first day of October AD 1830 Surveyed November the 7th 1830 unto Michael Freytag the above described Tract of Land being improved as pasture Land and within fence Situate in Blockley Township in the County of Philadelphia Containing Two Acres and thirty one perches improved about Seventy years. Beginning at a stake placed for a corner in the Land reputed to be of John Hare Powell, on the west side of the new Road leading from the Lancaster Turnpike Road to the upper Ferry called Bridge north Street at the distance of 96 1/2 perches northerly of the North Side of the said Lancaster Turnpike Road or High Street continued at right angles the said Road forming one side of the Right Angle Thence N 78 W [partly by Land reputed to be of the said John Hare Powell or of other devisees of the late Elizabeth Powell and partly by land of William Bingham or of the Trustees for M^{rs} Ann Bingham] 48.4 perches to a stake for a corner on said Bingham's Land Thence by said Land N 84 E 43.5 perches to a stake for a corner on the west side of the said New Road Thence by the said New Road S 15 3/4 E 15.2 perches to the Beginning. Containing two acres and thirty one perches. Being part of the Tract of Land mentioned as "The Burying Ground" in the patent granted to Thos Ducket dated the 16th of March AD 1697.
