



A Survey was executed by Jnth<sup>o</sup> Leet Esq<sup>r</sup> on a warrant granted to Ab<sup>o</sup> Kirkpatrick for 400 Ac<sup>e</sup> dated Feby 10<sup>th</sup> 1794 which warrant was conveyed to William Miller and Alexander Murray, and a patent issued in their names dated March the 22<sup>d</sup> 1804; I now certify that by some mistake in the original Survey, the bounds expressed in the Patent do not contain the lands intended, leaving out in some instances what it ought to include & including in others what the Patentees do not claim - the black lines represent the Survey as it ought to have been returned, the red lines represent the Bounds of the patent - there is no dispute in the Title - the Survey as made by me and exhibited by the black lines, contains 398 Ac<sup>e</sup> 63<sup>rs</sup> & y<sup>o</sup> All<sup>o</sup> and was executed Jan<sup>y</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> 1805 -
