



The Two Tracts of Land above described were Surveyd for Hugh Torbat in Pursuance of two Warrants from the Proprietaries of Pennsylv^a. One Granted to the said Hugh the 7th of December 1737. Another to his Brother John Torbatt the 24th of March 1742. (Vacating a former warrant bearing Date the 18th of July 1739, which was obtained by one John Scott & directing the Execution thereof for said John Torbatt) whose Right was transferd to the said Hugh Torbatt. The former warrant was Executed by my Father & formerly Return'd. But this Draught Exhibits both surveys in full & was Divided at the Request of the said Hugh Torbat as above the 12th of the 11th mo 1765

N.B. A Ticket in the Bottom of the Copy of the warrant directed a Report to be made of the Time of Settlement w^{ch} as near as I can come at it was abt the year 1736 But as a great Deal of it is Broken thin Land. I think 'tis scarcely Right to pay Quitrent for above 250^a thereof so far back G. C.
