



The bounds of the ^{of land} 20 acres set out & surveyed (o-b-l-i-t-e-r-a-t-e-d) to Caleb Pusey for the use of Chester Mills, begin at the (o-b-l-i-t-e-r-a-t-e-d) post standing by the south westerly side of Chester creek by the up (obliterated) of the bridge corner against the 5^d mills from thence S. 50. E down by (obliterated) creek to a marked corner black oak ^{10 perch} then S. 20. N. 42 perch to a (obl-) white oak being a corner tree of James Thomas's land thence N. 68. W. (obl) perch to a corner post standing by the side of a run which run divides the 5^d 20 acres from Robert Wades land then down the courses of the 5^d run to a marked corner spanish oak standing by the 5^d creek side thence N. 48. W. crossing the 5^d creek 6 perch to a corner stake to the 5^d creek side being also a corner stake of Thomas Brascas land then N. N. E. 57 perch to a marked corner post then E. S. E. 48 perch to a corner post being also a corner post of Caleb Puseys land thence S. 5. N. 80 perch to a corner post stand near the 5^d mills then S. 72. E 1/2 6 perch then S. 5. W 6 perch then N. 72. W 1/2 6 perch then S. 50. W 9 perch crossing the 5^d creek to the first mentioned corner post.
