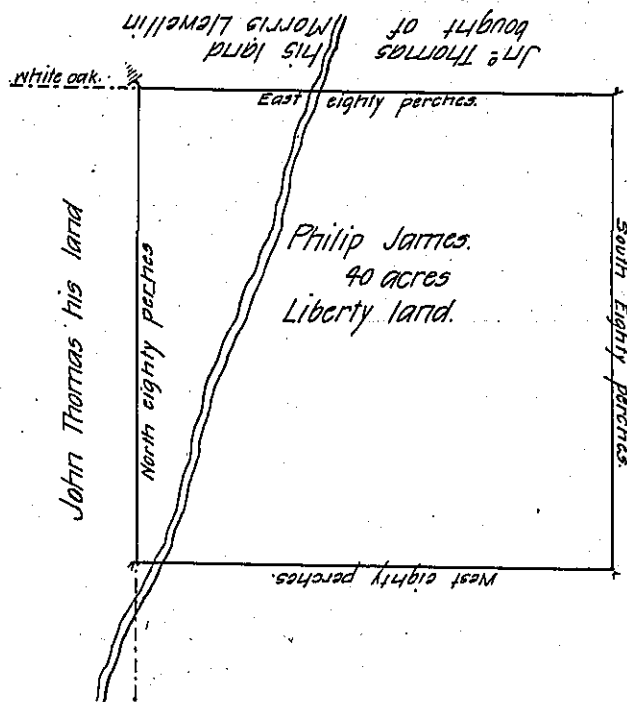

William Penn Absolute Proprietor and Governour in chief of the Province of Pennsylvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Philip James that I would grant him a Resurvey on a Tract of land in the Liberties of the City Philad^{la} laid out for forty acres on the West side of ~~side of~~ Schuylkil to Charles Jones purchaser of two thousand acres whose right to the same the said Philip has Purchased These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to ^{be} Resurveyed the said forty acres in the place where it was first laid out to the said Charles Jones and make returns thereof into my Secretarys office Given under my hand and seal at Philadelphia ye 31st day of the first month 1701.

Resurveyd for Philip James in pursuance of the above warrant the said tract of Liberty-land Beginning at a White oak at a corner of John Thomas land Thence east by the land late of Morris Llewellyn and other land eighty perches to a post Then south by a line of marked trees Eighty perches to a post Then by a line of marked trees West eighty perches to a post in a line of the said John Thomas land Then by the same north eighty perches to the place of Beginning Containing forty acres.
