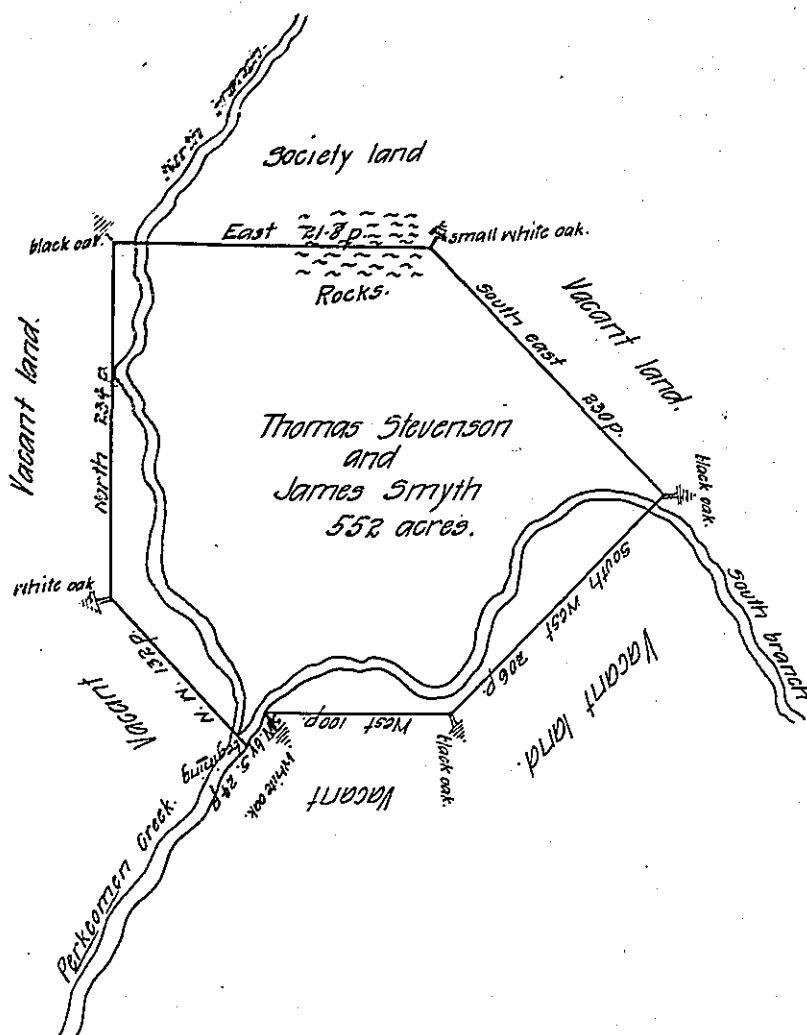


The Labour's last and useless this Return

By virtue of a warrant from the Proprietor bearing date the 25<sup>th</sup> day of the 8<sup>th</sup> month Anno Domini 1701, Surveyed & laid out unto the Assigns of William Pennington a certaine tract of land in a fork of Perkeormen Creek in the County of Philadelphia beginning at the 5<sup>d</sup> flock and extending north west by vacant land on the west side of the 5<sup>d</sup> Creek, to a white oak, one hundred thirty two perches. Then north by vacant land two hundred thirty four perches to a black oak, Then over the north branch by a corner of the Society Land east two hundred & eighteen perches to a small white oak, Then south east by vacant land two hundred & thirty perches to a black oak, Then over the south branch south west, two hundred & six perches to a black oak, Then by vacant land west one hundred perches to a white oak by the 5<sup>d</sup> south branch Then down the same south west by south twenty four perches to the mouth thereof being the place of beginning Containing five hundred fifty two acres. Surveyed the 9<sup>th</sup> day of the 6<sup>th</sup> month Anno Domini 1716.
