



By virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property to me directed bearing date the 19th day of the 3^d month 1702, Resurveyed unto Thomas Stackhous several small parcels of land joynted in one Tract lying in Middletownship in the County of Bucks Beginning at a post by Neshtarmenah Creek, being Ezra Grosdills corner, Thence by the said Ezra's land E 16 deg^{1/2} N 84 per to a black oak sapling, Then E 16 deg^{1/2} N 99 per to a black oak, Then S 5 deg^{1/2} E 70 per to a post, Then S 13 deg^{1/2} E 41 1/2 per to a post, Then W 19 deg^{1/2} N 56 per to a white oak, Then W 32 deg^{1/2} S 53 per to a post, Then by Joseph Grosdors's land S 19 deg^{1/2} E 52 per to a small Hickery, Then E 20 deg^{1/2} N 84 per to a heap of stones, Then east 80 per to a black oak, Then by Jeremiah Langhorn's land N 23 deg^{1/2} E 40 1/2 per to a black oak, Then E 10 deg^{1/2} N 47 per to a Crooked Hickery, Then E 8 deg^{1/2} N 246 per to a black oak, Then N 10 deg^{1/2} W 54 per to a Hickery, Then E by N 298 per to a post in Mary Bakers line, Then by the said line N by W 60 per to a burrit tree, Then by John Scarboroughs land W by S 360 per to a tree stump, Then N by W 32 1/2 per to a black oak, Then by John Stackhous land W by S 251 per to a black oak sapling, Then W by N 210 per to a Birch tree by the said Neshtarmenah — Then down the same to the place of Beginning Containing 512 Acres. Resurveyed the 8th day of the 5th month 1702.
