Layd out for John Sirmock 1100 Acres of Land Laying betwne. Crum Creek and Muckriton Creek upon the back of the 5<sup>d</sup> Sirmock, his former survey of a 1100 acres beginning at a marked poplar standing by Stone Creek and running along the Creek one severall courses to a marked Gum by the Creek side from thence N. W. b N. 386 perches to a marked white oke being the corner tree of Joseph Stedman and from thence running N. E. b E. 182 perches to a marked poplar from thence E. b S to a marked Red oke being the corner tree of Thomas Bracey from thence S. S. E. 996 perches to a marked pall from thence along the run down one severall courses to a marked red oke from thence N. b. S. 29(66) perches to the first marked oke.
