Pursuant to a warrant to me directed by Edward Pennington, Surveyor General of the Province of Pennsylvania, bearing date the 13th day of the 11th month 1700, to resurvey unto Abel Janney a tract of land in the Township of Makefield and County of Bucks and Province aforesaid which said tract begins at a poplar standing by the side of the River Delaware being at a corner of Richard Houghts land Thence west thirty deg^s south fifty seven perches to an oak Then west Twenty deg^s south thirty perches to an oak Then west two deg^s south thirty seven perches to a white oak Then west Twelve deg^s south forty eight perches to a black oak Then west six deg^s south to a great forked black oak ^{fifty six perches} Then west one deg^s south one hundred and thirty perches to a gum tree by a run sides Then west five deg^s north Twenty eight perches to a white oak Then west two deg^s north eighty nine perches to a Spanish oak Then west three deg^s south two hundred and Twenty perches to an oak Then still by the said Houghts land west three hundred seventy two perches to a white oak being another corner of the said Houghts land Then by Thomas Janneys land north four deg^s west fifty seven perches to a white oak being another corner of other land belonging to the said Abel Janney Then by the said land east four hundred and fifty perches to a gum tree in a Swamp then by the (obl.) land and other land formerly belonging to one Turnerliff east one deg^s south one hundred and fifty perches to a white oak Then east eight deg^s north fifty perches to a black oak Then east two deg^s north eighty four perches to a Spanish oak Then east eight deg^s north ninety four perches to a Chestnut Tree Then east two deg^s south eighty two perches to a Spanish oak Then east ten deg^s north seventy eight perches to a Spanish oak standing by the River Delaware aforesaid Then down the courses of the said River south sixty five deg^s east ten perches Then south seventy three deg^s east sixteen perches Then south seventy deg^s east forty nine perches to the poplar the place of beginning Resurveyed for three hundred sixty five acres & twelve perches ^{Phineas Ferriertori.} the 13 day of the 2 month. 1701.
