



By vertue of a warrant from Edward Pennington Surveyor General directed unto me bearing date the 24th day of the 5th mo. 1707. I hereby certify into his office that I have reassured to Thomas Fairman a certaine tract of land in the County of Philadelphia begining at a stake-sett in the ground in a line deviding Joseph Fishers land and a certaine tract of of land formerly called Robert Turners land but now called Gwynedd from thence by the said line of marked trees south east 159 perches to a stake-sett in the ground in the same line deviding it from Joseph Fishers land from thence by a line of marked trees and sd Fishers land north east 487 perches to another stake-sett in the ground hard by a w^{ch} oak marked for a corner from thence by an old line of marked trees north west 159 perches to a post sett in the ground in the line of Dillins land from thence by a former line of marked trees south west 487 perches to the place of Begining Containeing and reassured for foure hundred eighty & three acres & a half & 73 perches the 13 of the 3^d mo. ensuing.
