

Whereas the Commissioners of Property by their warrant dated the 25th day of the first month 1715. Required me to survey to John Falconer and Andrew Hamilton sixty acres of land in the Liberties of Philadelphia and whereas the said Andrew Hamilton and Gilbert Falconer brother of the said John Falconer by Deeds dated the 22^d & 23^d days of April convey'd the said land to Isaac Norris. This may certify that on the 23 day of April Anno 1723. I survey'd for the said Isaac Norris a piece of land in the said Liberties, Beginning at a corner post at a corner of Thomas Galowhills land and running by land of the said Isaac Norris south south east one hundred and five perches to a post. Then by Job Goodson's Land west south west sixty three perches to a post Then north north west by the said Goodson's land ninety two perches ~~to~~ Then on the same course thirteen perches by Thomas Galowhills land to a Post Then by another line of the said Galowhills land east north east sixty three perches to the place of beginning containing forty acres.

In pursuance of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date the 16th day of January in the year 1726. I did on the 20th day of 8th 1727 survey and Lay out for Isaac Norris Esquire a piece of land in the Liberties of Philadelphia beginning at a post at a corner John Ashmead's land and a corner of Joseph Skipper's land Thence south south east by the said Joseph Skipper's land sixty two perches Then west south west by Joseph Skipper's land and John Shires Land ninety perches. Then north north west by vacant Land and William Palmer's land sixty two perches to a post. Then east south east ninety perches to the place of Beginning containing thirty four acres and one hundred and forty perches in part of thirty six acres remaining due on the Purchase of six thousand acres made by Charles Marshal and Company

N. B. One acre (& 20 perches) deficient here is to be supplied.
