



By virtue of a warrant from the Courte of Upland.
 Layed out for John Glasers, a tract of land Called Vianna Situated and being on ye west side of Delaware River and on the east side of Neshaminyes Creek.
 Beginning at a corner marked Chestnut oak standing at the mouth of a small runn by the side of Neshaminyes Creek from thence up by sd Creek N & N b W 150 perches to a corner marked Spanish oak standing by ye maine creek and from thence E b N by a line of marked trees 320 perches to a corner marked oak from thence S b E by a line of marked trees 130 perches to a corner marked white oak standing by ye side of a marsh from thence S. W by a line of marked trees 160 perches to a corner marked Spanish oak standing by a Swamp branch and from thence downe by sd branch on severall Courses 200 perches to the first mentioned Chestnut oak. Containing 300 acres of land unto w^{ch} land belongeth a parcel of marsh containing about 8 acres being by ye above sd creek about a mile ~~being~~ from sd land.
