



Bullings and boundings of two hundred acres of land surveyed unto Samuel Allin by virtue of the Surveyors Gen^l warrant. Beginning at a black oke standing near the mouth of a little run on the south west side of Neshannony Creeke thence north west up the said Runn by the land formerly layed out to Dunkan Williams and Francis Walke forty perches to a white oke marked for a corner thence north by the said Williams and Walkers land three hundred and fourteen perches to a post for a corner. Thence west south west one hundred and seventeen perches to a post for another corner. Thence south two hundred and sixty perches to a post for another corner. Thence south east and by east one hundred forty five perches to a post for another corner standing close to the barke of Neshannony Creeke thence up by the severll courses of the said Creeke sixty five perches to the first mentioned corner marked black oke 9⁺ 200^a
