



A Draft of A Tract of Land situate in the head of the Great Cove in Air township Bedford County Containing twenty nine acres and seventy eight perches and allowance of six per cent for Roads & so. Surveyed for John McClelland the _____ day of _____ on Warrant dated the 8th day of June, 1762.

No. 1. represented by dotted lines is part of the draft of a tract of land surveyed for Joseph Woods on Warrant dated the 16th day of August, 1785. this tract interferes twenty seven acres and one hundred and fifty for perches with the John McClelland survey. John McClelland conveyed to Hill Wilson who conveyed to Frederick Humbert, who conveyed to Phillip Coleman, who conveyed to William Wilson, who conveyed to Christopher Nead who also purchased the aforesaid warrant from Joseph Woods and had it executed on the John McClelland survey. Christopher Nead conveyed to Christian Waggoner the present owner.

No. 2 represented by dotted lines is part of the draft of a tract of land surveyed for Ann Dewese on Warrant dated the 15th day of February 1794, this tract interferes one acre and thirty perches with the John McClelland survey. Ann Dewese conveyed to Benjamin Burd who conveyed to Christian Waggoner the present owner who also claims the interference under John McClelland.

N.B. The green lines represent part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for John & Hugh McClelland on Order No 589 dated the 1st day of August, 1766 this tract interferes fifty perches with the John McClelland survey. John & Hugh McClelland conveyed to Mathias Ambrose who conveyed the interference to Thomas Paxton who conveyed to Adam Russ who conveyed to Christian Waggoner who also claimed under John McClelland and is the present owner.
