



The Tract No. 1 was surveyed on Application No. 745 dated 3<sup>rd</sup> of April, 1769, and a warrant issued 7<sup>th</sup> of August inst unto William McDowell 300 a 105 Patented No. 2 was surveyed on Application No. 3626 dated 8<sup>th</sup> of July, 1769 warrant of acceptance issued to Elizabeth Mitchell dated 23<sup>rd</sup> of September, 1787 Patented No. 3 was surveyed on Application No. 3627 dated 8<sup>th</sup> of July, 1769, and warranted in the name of John Sloan Patented Nos. 4 & 5 was surveyed on orders No. 22 & and 2003 unto Samuel & David Sloan, Contains 521 as returned in the name of Samuel Sloan, all patented Patented No. 6 was surveyed on a warrant of 20<sup>th</sup> of May, 1786 granted to James Scott and a patent to Knight Scott Patented on location No. 348 Patented No. 7 was tract warranted to Elias Davison but could not ascertain date and the other part we could not find out sufficiently accurate to admit of reporting as it was a very early survey and the the records were then kept in Bedford county and has now had so many owners that the conveyances do no longer specify the original, but is all now patented and was never held by these locations No. 8 was surveyed on a warrant granted to William Findley Esq. dated March 22, 1785 Pat'd Patented No. 9 was surveyed on order No. 10 300 as patented and the small tract No. 10 was surveyed on a warrant of December 28<sup>th</sup> 1772 unto Robert Sloan 34 as 100 p. R. Sloan Pat'd

I have adopted this plan, though more troublesome and difficult than the usual way, yet believing it to be more satisfactory as it furnishes at once a view of the locality of that section of the Loyalhanna locations of which there are so many that would have been difficult to understand if explained on separate sheets and believe it to be as accurate as any could be made at this period
