Stover dated June 10th, 1762 The part marked D. is included in a survey containing 190 as 40 per & all made in pursuance of a warrant granted Wm. Stover dated the 18th <sup>May</sup> 1763 Christian Shelly & Emanuel Stover owners & occupiers who claim the same on the rights above recited.
