In pursuance of a contract made with the Board of Property dated the 19th of Octob: 1827, for the purpose and intent of discovering the boundaries of the original survey of William Ramsey. Resurveyed the above described tract of land some time since, by which it contains four hundred and sixteen acres and the allowance of Six Pr. Ct. &c. Situate in Kittanning township Armstrong County bounded by Crooted Creek, lands of Robert Walter and others. That part of the above described tract of land of which the situation and boundaries is represented by the figure including the letter B, was surveyed to J. Arnold, pr. County draught and the present owner— Miller, and that part represented by the figure including the letter A was surveyed to Mary Field in pursuance of a warrant dated the 2nd of Dec: 1793 and is now in possession of a tenant of James Hamilton of Carlisle P.A. who is the present owner perhaps by right descending from Mary Field.

N.B. We have no original draught of the survey of William Ramsey but by reference of other papers in this office the survey is bounded by lands (afterwards) surveyed to Michael Huffnagle on the North, Crooted Creek on the South, lands surveyed to Isaac Melcher on the east and extending westward so far as to complete the survey, and the eastern boundary lines are well marked and defined but the precise limits westward is unknown as the lines cannot be found, and conclusively by reference it appears that a survey had been made to William Ramsey within the boundaries represented by the preceding diagram in pursuance of the Order of the 3d of Ap: 1769, No. 69.
