The above Parallelogram containing one hundred forty five ^{acres} seventy seven perches and allowance is a survey made May 29th, 1828, in pursuance of a grant from or under the Proprietary Government to John Crush for three hundred acres dated 3rd April, 1769, Appln. No 717 and agreeable to an Act of Assembly passed March 22nd, 1820 & 25 & 26 and is situated in now Hopewell and Moon Townships (the Township line passing through the same) in Beaver County Note that segment of the above survey north of Plattoon Creek belongs to and is occupied by George Bruses heirs. The southern segment belongs to and is in possession of Wm. McCune. That part of the above parallelogram that belongs to Bruses Heirs consists of 54 acres of Charles Bruses Warrent and 35 acres of Abraham Gums Warrent. That part of the above parallelogram that belongs to William McCune consists of 59 acres 124 perches of Hannah Gums Warrent and five acres and 70 perches of Abraham Gums Warrent all strict measure.
