


Noble.



A draught of a piece of Mead<sup>d</sup> Ground situate between the lands of Moyamensing, Nicoco & Delaware River, resurveyed for Clemt<sup>t</sup> Plumsted Esq<sup>r</sup>. Beg<sup>d</sup> at a post by<sup>e</sup> side of ye Great Road lead<sup>d</sup> to Greenwich Point being also a corner of Stilley's Mead<sup>d</sup> Ground & from thence easterly by<sup>e</sup> sd Stilley's Mead<sup>d</sup> & Mead<sup>d</sup> Ground late of And<sup>n</sup> Wheeler (0 6 1) West 64 1/2 ft<sup>d</sup> to a post between two ash trees marked Thence by Joseph Nobl<sup>d</sup> Mead<sup>d</sup> ground N 1 E 63 1/2 ft<sup>d</sup> to a Qd<sup>d</sup> Post where formerly a marked Hickory stood Thence by Mead<sup>d</sup> ground now of John Howell S 88 1/2 E 28 p<sup>d</sup> to a corner of other mead<sup>d</sup> Ground lately patent<sup>d</sup> to sd G. P. Th<sup>r</sup> by<sup>e</sup> same S 3 E 35 p<sup>d</sup> to a post & east 26 ft<sup>d</sup> to ye sd Great Road Th<sup>r</sup> by<sup>e</sup> same S 16 E 29 to ye Beg<sup>d</sup> contg<sup>d</sup> 15 95 150 p<sup>d</sup> Resurvey'd Ap<sup>r</sup> 6, 1743.
