



In pursuance of the several Acts of Assembly directing the recovery of the principal and interest due to the Commonwealth from persons holding lands by virtue of locations or other office titles issued from or under the Proprietary Government and by the authority of the board of property I have this 20th day of February, 1828, surveyed the above described tract of three hundred and two acres & a half and allowance on the North Side of Conemaugh including an old Indian Town joining Alexander Culbertsons Claim and lands of James Campbell, Thomas Wilkins and others situate in Blacklick Township in the County of Indiana by virtue of a ^{Location} ~~Warrant~~ granted to Joseph Culbertson on the 3d of April, 1769, No. 380

By virtue of two warrants one dated 18 March the other 5 Decr. 1786 and that part including the letter E. was surveyed to William Beard the 1st May 1786 by warr. of the 13th February 1786. ~~if this must be a mistake should I think be 1787.~~
