



William Ford's Land situate pt in Chester & pt in ye County of Newcastle, Begins at an Ash by a smal Run (being a Branch of Naamans Creek) at a Corner of Richd^d Handby's Land then up the 5^d Run 76 pches to a White Oak, thence N.W. by North of George Griswold 56 pches to a Hickory, thence North East by ye Land late of Robt Cloot & Benj^d Moulder 187 pches to a Spanish Oak by another Branch of the 5^d Naamans Creek, then down the 5^d Branch 264 pches to an Ash, thence W.S. West 70 pches to a White Oak, thence South 10° West 38 pches to a Black Oak at a corner of Francis Reynolds's Land, thence by the same South 13° East 105 pches to a White Oak, thence ~~West by South~~ 38 pches to a Black Oak, thence S. 19° W. ten pches to a post, thence S. 55° W. by the Land of Adam Buckley 20 pches to a Chestnut Tree, thence North W. by N. by the same Land 110 pches to the place of Beginning Containing three Hundred & forty acres and the allowance of Six p Cent.

Note this Tract includes the 2 pces Land formerly Lay'd out to Patrick Kelly & John Kennedy with ye adjacent Vacancys
