



William Ford's Land situate pt. in Chester & pt. in y^e County of Newcastle, Begins at an Ash by a Small Run (being a Branch of Naamans Creek) at a Corner of Rich^d Handley's Land then up the 5th Run 76 pches to a White Oak, thence N.W. by North of George Griste 56 pches to a Hickory, thence North East by y^e Land late by y^e Land late of Robt Cloud & Benj^m Moulder 187 pches to a Spanish Oak by another Branch of the 5th Naamans Creek, then down the 5th Branch 264 pches to an Ash, thence W.S. West 70 pches to a White Oak, thence South 10th West 38 pches to a Black Oak at a corner of Francis Reynolds's Land, thence by the Same South 13th East 105 pches to a White Oak thence ~~West~~ West by South 38 pches to a Black Oak, thence S. 19th West ten pches to a post, thence S. 55th W. by the Land of Adam Buckley 20 pches to a Chesnut Tree, thence North W. by N. by the Land of the 5th Richard Handley 100 pches to a White Oak, thence N.W. by W. by the Same Land 110 pches to the place of Beginning Containing three Hundred & forty acres and the Allowance of Six p Cent.
