This is to Certify that I have Resurveyed unto John Beales A Certain tract of Land Caled Herald in the County of Chester and township of Aston & one the South west Side of Chester Creek begining at A bounded or Corner marked beech tree standing by the Side of Chester Creek from thence by A Line of marked trees N: S: W: 201 perches to A Corner marked black oke standing by A run from thence up the S: W: side of A narrow marsh N: W: 1/2 perches to A Stake or post being the Corner post of Anthony Weavers Land and so one the Sd Cours 95 perches to a staghe or post standing by a small run runing into the Sd marsh from thence N: W: 1/2 N: 40 perches to A Dead standing Oke from thence N: W: b: n: 1/2 n: 26 perches to A Corner marked whit Oke standing in the Line of Joseph Richards Land from thence north 25 perches to A Corner <sup>Red</sup> Oke from thence oblique — Along the rode leading to the mill 134 perches to A Corner marked black oke stand by Chester Creek Side from thence traving the severall Coursis of the Sd Creek to the first mentioned Corner tree Containing and resurveyed for 128 acres of fast Land and marsh this 20<sup>th</sup> Day of the 4<sup>th</sup> Mynth 1694.
