



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Rockhill Township in the County of Bucks and Province of Pennsylvania Being Part of Mr. Thomas Frames Marmor. Beginning at a Post in the Line of John Rhoades Land, Thence by the same and by Land of Dewald Nease, South West 160 Perches to a Post, in a Line of Land in Tenure of Jacob Nease, Thence by the same and by Land in Tenure of Phillip Henry Sellen. North 47 degrees West 239 perches to a Post in a line of William Mayburys Land, Thence by the same and by other Land of the said Dewald Nease, North East 84 perches and four Tenths of a Perch to a Bench Tree marked for a Corner of Land in Tenure of John Peter Strmeider, Thence by the same South East 120 Perches to a Black Oak Sapling and North East 84 Perches to a Post in a line of the said Dewald Nease's other Land, Thence by the same South East 119 Perches to the Place of Beginning, Containing One hundred and Eighty Two Acres and 44 Perches or One hundred and Seventy one Acres and 153 perches of Land, together with the Usual Allowance of Six per Cent for Roads. Surveyed for the said Dewald Nease. March 1st 1758.
