Report - That <sup>part</sup> ~~above~~ of the above tract marked A containing 54 acres 83 perches is included in a larger tract of 212 a<sup>s</sup> survey'd (& said to be patented) on a warrant to John Blair dated 5 October 1743 owned and occupied by John Lutz. The part marked B containing 46.0.134 p. was recognized as the Meeting House land by John Blairs survy above mentioned & I have not been able to ascertain by what right that part of the land is held. Note the warrant to Craighead locates on the West Side of the Branch yet the Church, Grave <sup>Yard</sup> & Church land has as I am informed always been on the East Side as marked.
