



Draft of a tract of Land situate in Peters Township (formerly Hopewell Township), Franklin County Containing Four hundred & twenty eight acres, one hundred & nineteen perches & allowance of six per cent for Roads &c. Surveyed the 12th of December 1828. (On a warrant granted Andrew Dunlap for 400 as. of land on a westerly branch of Conococheague, called Clouds Branch about 3 miles Northwesterly from Edward Carnells in Hopewell township dated the 4th of Feb'y, 1737.) In pursuance of a Contract with the Board of Property for carrying into effect the several Acts of Assembly relating to Proprietary Rights &c.

The land above described is the same land as held by a survey containing 341 as. & all. which was surveyed in pursuance of a Warrant granted John Black dated the 1st of March 1737. the red lines with the black lines 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 describe the original survey on Black's Warrant but by a survey on the ground it is found to extend to the black lines as returned on Dunlap's Warrant. No evidence appears of any survey having been made on Dunlap's warrant but from a copy from the records of the Court of Lancaster County Dunlap was in possession of the land above described & was dispossessed by Black.
