The part marked C containing 69 as. 105 per. & all is part of a survey of 236 as. & all which was surveyed on a warrant granted Edward Shippen dated the 1st of November 1745 under which rights the present owners claim. There is no evidence of any survey having been made on And^w Cooks Warrt.
