To Jacob Spangler Esq: S.G. Doctor William Smith not pat'd. John Armstrong, pat'd. Nicholas Shouffer, not pat'd
 Edward Ward, pat'd. The yellow lines represent the draught of a Tract of Land surveyed for Doctor William
 Smith on warrant dated the 20th day of July, 1765. This tract interferes fifty five acres with the Edward Henry
 Survey. Dr. William Smith devised this tract to Charles Smith the present owner. The green lines represent
 a draught of a tract of land surveyed for John Armstrong on warrant dated the 23rd day of September, 1762. This
 tract interferes one hundred and seventy acres and one hundred and seventeen perches with the Edward Henry
 Survey. John Armstrong conveyed to William Heer the present owner. The pink colored lines represent the
 survey John Armstrong surveyed for Nicholas Shouffer on warrant dated the 29th day of October 1762. This tract
 interferes forty one acres with the Edward Henry Survey. Nicholas Shouffer conveyed to John Little & John
 Lutters who conveyed to Moses Donaldson who conveyed to Henry Hypher who conveyed to Matthew Simpson who
 devised to Wm. Simpson who conveyed to the P. & D. of the Huntingdon Bank the present owners. The black dotted
 lines represent part of a draught of a tract of land surveyed for Edward Ward on Warrant dated the 23d day of
 June, 1762. This tract interferes thirty six acres with the Edward Henry Survey. Edward Ward conveyed to his heirs
 who conveyed to Alexander McConnel who devised the same to his widow & heirs from whom it was sold by the
 Sheriff of Huntingdon County to Peter Swope the present owner. The red dotted lines represent part of a
 draught of a tract of land surveyed for John Port on an improvement made about 20 years. John Port conveyed to
 Henry Clabaugh who conveyed to John Yocom the present owner. Said survey interferes two acres with the
 Edward Henry Survey.
