

Situate in Shrewsbury Township, York County the two tracts Called Earharts Tavern and Earharts Valley Originally surveyed for Thomas Brimer for William Earhart (all in one tract) but now in Pursuance of a warrant of Surveyory dated the 15<sup>th</sup> of ~~Augt~~ September 1773 the same was Resurveyed on the 6, 9, & 10<sup>th</sup> days of the 11<sup>th</sup> month and Brimers old lines exactly followed and Likewise divided into two several Tracts to be Patented accordingly (viz) Earharts Tavern In pursuance of two warrants one for 100<sup>ac</sup> the other for 50<sup>ac</sup> both bearing date the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 1763 and Earharts Valley In pursuance of a warrant for 100<sup>ac</sup> dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1753 and that Tract called Earharts Fancy was at the same time Surveyed for William Earhart In pursuance of his appl<sup>r</sup> # 2360 for 100<sup>ac</sup> dated the 17<sup>th</sup> day of January 1763 and is unimproved.
