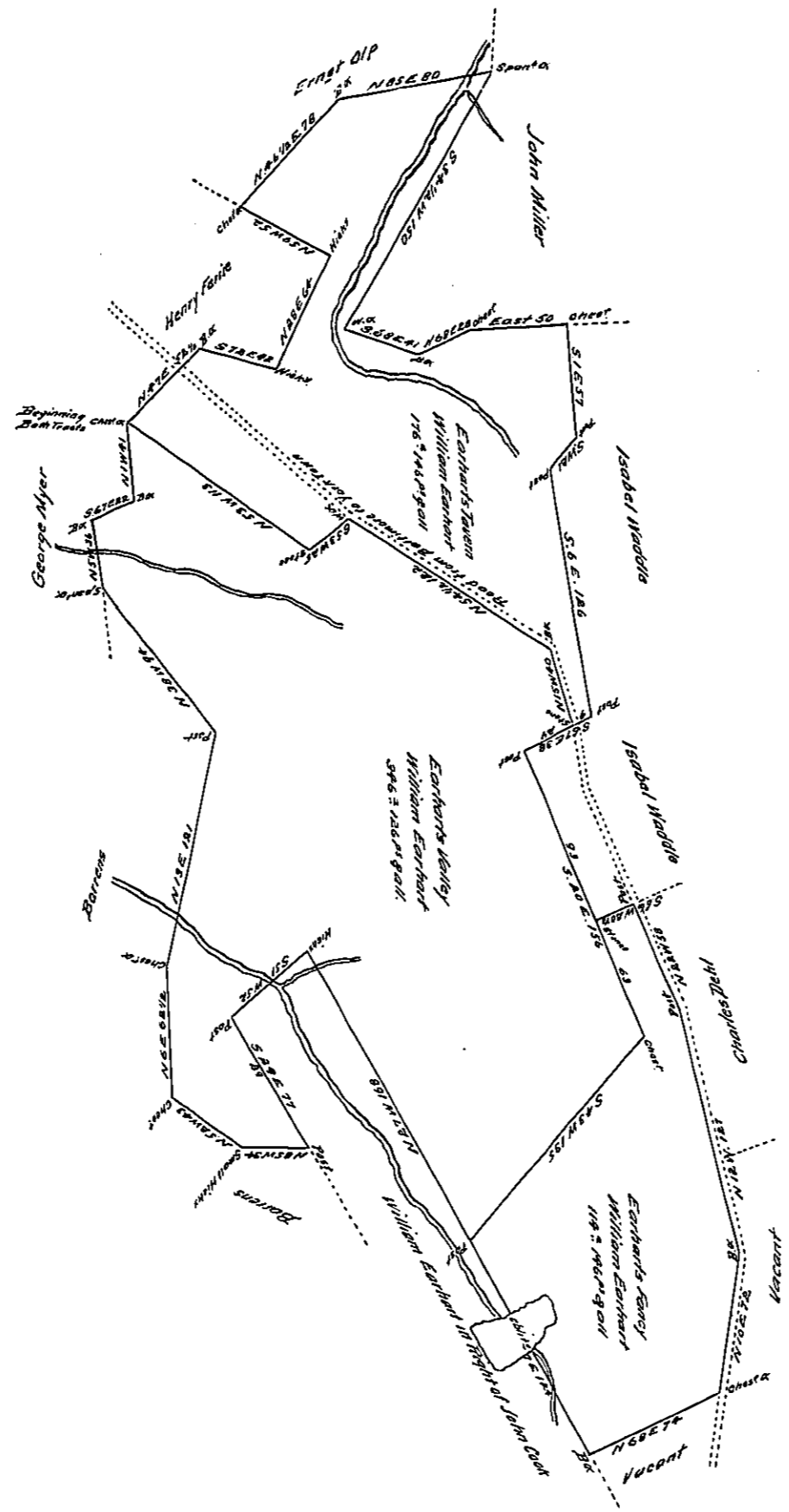

Situate in Shrewsbury township York County the two tracts called Earhart's Tavern and Earhart's Valley originally surveyed for Thomas Armor for William Earhart (all in one tract) but now in Pursuance of a warrant of Resurvey dated the 13th of ~~Dec~~ September 1773 the same was Resurveyed on the 6th 9th & 11th days of the 12th mo 1773 and Arms old lines exactly set and Likewise divided into two several Tracts to be Patented accordingly (viz) Earhart's Tavern in pursuance of two Warrants one for 100^{ac} the other for 50^{ac} both bearing date the 31st day of May 1763 and Earhart's Valley in pursuance of a Warrant for 100^{ac} dated the 6th day of August 1753 and that Tract called Earhart's Fancy was at the same time surveyed for William Earhart in pursuance of his applⁿ N^o 23 60 for 100^{ac} dated the 14th day of January 1767 and is unimproved.
