

To Surveyor General of Penn.
I, John L. Pearson of Fidley in Delaware County having been duly appointed and commissioned Deputy surveyor in and for said County &c and having been duly attested as such, did on the 26th day of June A.D. 1839 by virtue of the foregoing warrant from the land office for dated October 1st 1838, with two attested chain-carriers of good character, proceed to survey the land mentioned & described in the said warrant, Beginning at a peg in the middle of a road leading from Springfield road to the Providence road, and in the township of Springfield in the county of Delaware, and in a line of land late Morris Weston, thence in the line of the same, and on and near an old worm fence South eighty two degrees and a quarter East twenty seven perches and five tenths to a stake in the line of Owen Broads's land, thence along the line of the same and on an old worm fence & an old dry ditch South twenty seven degrees & a quarter East twenty five perches & sixty five hundredths to a stake, in a corner of where an old worm fence had stood (and which old fence formerly inclosed the land of the late Thomas Shipleys & afterwards Cyrus Newlin) thence along & about where the said old worm fence had formerly stood (for upwards of forty years) South seventy nine degrees and three quarters west fifty eight perches to a stake in the middle of the aforesaid road, thence along the middle of the said road North twenty five degrees & a quarter East forty two perches and one tenth to the place of beginning. Containing seven acres three quarters and twenty four perches & an half of land, (being covered principally with timber &c as per draft and calculation hereto annexed.)
