

Warrant granted to Samuel Dryden for one hundred Acres of Land bounded by land of the Heirs of Jas Elliot dec'd. by land of Peter Erhart dec'd & Land of Robt McKeerney, lands of the Heirs of Wm Plumsted Esq. dec'd. Samuel Liggot & Wm Ferguson in Letterkenny and Hamilton Townships in the County of Franklin Dated the 27th Day of February 1786.

Warrant granted to Samuel Dryden & Owen Astor for one hundred & thirty acres of land bounded by land of William Ferguson, John Kirkpatrick, Robt McKeerney & other land of Samuel Dryden in Hamilton Township in the County of Franklin. Dated the 2nd Day of November 1792.

Warrant granted to Samuel Purviance for two hundred acres of land bounded by land of Robert Dixon, Alexander Mears, Ludwig Boats and Samuel Liggot Hamilton Township in the County of Franklin. Dated the 29th Day of December 1792.

In Pursuance of an order of the Honorable the Board of Property bearing Date the 1st Day of January 1793, in the Case, Samuel Dryden vs. Heirs of William Plumsted, resurveyed the above two Tracts of Land situate chiefly in Hamilton Township, a small Part it seems in Letterkenny Township, in the County of Franklin, and block'd as many of the Corners, & line Trees as appeared to me to be of any use in throwing light on the Subject, as required, (the Timber in those Parts not being generally favorable for ascertaining the Dates of Surveys by blocking) - My observations taken in the Field the 7th 8th & 9th of March 1793 are as follows viz: In Survey No. 1. block'd a Ch. o. at the beginning of line (N. 52 E.) which counted 39 years, and at the end of the said line block'd the B. o. Corner which counted 39 years to the bottom of a notch, and underneath the Notch counted in the same block about 55 in all the bottom of what appears to have been a Notch made previous to the first the lowermost growths being somewhat obscure. In line (N. E.) block'd a B. o. which counted 39 years. Line (N. 76 E.) found unfavorable for blocking. In line (N. 52 W.) block'd a W. o. which counted 25 years. In line (N. 71 W.) block'd a B. o. which counted 25 years. In Division line (S. 89 1/2 W.) block'd a W. o. & a B. o. and each counted 25 years, and in line (S. 71 E.) of this Survey block'd a W. o. about 2 ft. distant from the Post at the end of Division line which counted 4 years. In Survey No. 2. the line (N. 71 W.) running chiefly through cleared Ground, no blocking to be had. On or near Line (N. 38 W.) block'd a Sp. o. which counted 35 or 36 years, and at the end of this line block'd the B. o. Corner which counted 35 or 35 years. In line (N. 71 E.) block'd a W. o. & two B. o. each counting 25 years. In line (N. 71 E.), altho' there are a number of marked Trees, found them unfavorable for blocking. In line (S. 71 1/2 E.) block'd a B. o. which counted 39 years and near to it block'd a W. o. the notches in which appear of a late date. In line (S. 68 E.) block'd a Hic, the years growths indeterminate, and in the same block'd two W. o. both which counted 25 years, and at the end of the same line block'd the Hic. Corner which counted 25 years, but somewhat obscure. I observe on the survey no. 2, are pretty extensive Improvements in the way of cleared land, some part of which appears very old, and am informed, have been begun upwards of forty years ago - these Improvements have of latter years been considerably extended over the Division Line into Survey No. 1. Samuel Dryden obtained a Warrant for that Part of No. 1, lying Northeastward of the dotted Line, and obtained a survey in the Manner I have formerly represented in my Return. Samuel Dryden, & Owen Astor have obtained a Warrant for the Residue of No. 1, or the greater Part thereof, dated as above. Samuel Purviance hath obtained a Warrant for the Survey No. 2, or the greater Part thereof dated as above. The whole humbly submitted to the Board.
