

These are to Certifie That By Virtue of a Warrant under the hand and seal of Edward Pennington Sur^r Gen^r to me directed bearing date ye^r 26th day of ye^r Seventh Month 1761 I Presured to Walter Faustt and Edward Pritchett a tract of Land situate in Ridley Township in ye^r County of Chester Beginning at a black oak standing by Crum Creek thence South 43 degrees Westerly 31 perches to a Hickory thence South 43 degrees Easterly in the Line of ye^r Neals 383 perches to a Post standing by Delaware River thence North 85 deg. Easterly 60 perches by ye^r 5th River to a Post standing by a Gulf or Port of Crum Creek then up ye^r 5th Gulf or Run eight perches to ye^r 5th Creek 365 perches to ye^r first mentioned black oak Containing 108 Acres. Which sd Tract I subdivided into ten parts or lots viz four of Marsh & six of fast Land. Walter Faustt his first Lot of Marsh begineth at a Maple in ye^r line of the Neals thence South 47 deg. Easterly 65 perches to a Post by Delaware River then up ye^r 5th River North 85 deg. East 35 perches to a post then North 35 deg. West in ye^r line of Edward Pritchett's Marsh 95 perches to a post thence South 62 deg. West 11 50 perches to ye^r first mentioned Maple (lot 1) containing 21 acres & a quarter. Walter Faustt his second Lot of Marsh begineth at a white oak by the side of Edward Pritchett's Field w^s South 25 deg. 30 mi. Easterly in ye^r line of Edward Pritchett 71 perches to a White tree standing by Crum Creek thence north 63 deg. East 45 up said Creek 24 perches to a post thence North 25 deg. 30 min. West 14 74 perches to a black oak thence South 62 deg. West 14 74 perches to ye^r first mentioned white oak Containing 10 Acres & three quarters. Edward Pritchett his first Lot of fast Land and two Lots of Marsh begineth at a maple being the corner of Walter Faustt's Marsh Land 24 perches to ye^r first mentioned white oak Containing 10 Acres & three quarters. Edward Pritchett his first Lot of fast Land and two Lots of Marsh begineth at a post thence down the Middle of the Lane North 50 deg. East 41 perches to a black oak by thence North 47 deg. West 14 74 in the Line of ye^r Neals 32 perches to a Post thence north 63 deg. East 45 perches in the Line of Walter Faustt to a post thence down the Middle of the Lane North 50 deg. East 41 perches to a black oak standing on ye^r side of Crum Creek thence down ye^r 5th Creek east 67 perches thence South 25 deg. 30 min. West 14 74 23 perches to a post by ye^r 5th Creek thence North 25 deg. 30 min. West 14 74 perches to a black oak standing on ye^r side of the fast Land then South 62 deg. West 11 20 perches to a white oak thence South 25 deg. 30 min. East 41 71 perches to a White Tree by Crum Creek thence 62 deg. West 11 20 perches in ye^r line of Walter Faustt's Marsh to a Post then South 62 deg. West 14 50 East 41 20 perches to a post by Delaware (lot 2) or thence down the said River South 85 deg. West 11 25 perches to a Post thence North 35 deg. West 11 95 perches in ye^r line of Walter Faustt's Marsh to a Post then South 62 deg. West 14 50 Perches to the first mentioned Maple Containing one Lot of fast Land being 23 Acres and two lots of marsh the one being 21 Acres the other Eleven Acres. Walter Faustt his first Lot of fast Land begineth at a Hickory in the Line of ye^r 5th Creek (lot 3) then South 47 deg. Easterly 26 perches to a Post in ye^r Line of ye^r Neals thence North 63 deg. East 11 in ye^r Line of Edward Pritchett 50 perches to a Post thence down the said neⁿ north 50 deg. Easterly 41 perches to a black oak by Crum Creek then up ye^r 5th Creek North 23 deg. West 11 16 perches then north 35 deg. East 11 16 perches then north 15 East 11 14 perches then south 60 deg. West 14 74 perches to a Dog Wood Tree by ye^r 5th Creek then South 43 deg. West 11 16 perches to a black oak by ye^r 5th Creek then up ye^r 5th Creek North 23 deg. West 11 16 perches to a small black oak thence South 62 deg. West 14 50 perches to ye^r first mentioned Hickory Containing thirteen acres - being ye^r corner of Walter Faustt's Lot thence north forty seven degrees westerly 26 perches to a Spanish oak in the line of ye^r Neals thence north 50 deg. East 11 98 perches to an ash by Crum Creek thence down ye^r 5th Creek north 80 deg. Easterly 14 74 perches in ye^r line of Edward Pritchett 70 perches to a small black oak thence South 62 deg. West 14 50 perches to ye^r first mentioned Hickory Containing sixteen acres - being ye^r corner of Edward Pritchett's Lot thence north forty three deg. West 14 74 perches to a small black oak thence South 62 deg. West 14 50 perches to ye^r first mentioned Hickory Containing sixteen acres - 28 perches to a dog wood tree thence in ye^r line of Walter Faustt South forty three deg. West 14 74 perches to a small black oak thence North 47 deg. Easterly in ye^r Line of ye^r Neals 36 perches to a black oak thence North 50 deg. Easterly 66 perches to a dog wood tree by Crum Creek then down ye^r 5th Creek South 82 deg. East 41 54 perches to an ash then in ye^r line of Edward Pritchett South 50 deg. West 11 98 perches to ye^r first mentioned Spanish oak Containing seventeen acres & three quarters. Edward Pritchett his third Lot of fast Land begineth at a black oak in the line of ye^r Neals thence North 50 deg. East 41 in ye^r line of Walter Faustt sixty six perches to a dog wood tree by Crum Creek then up ye^r 5th Creek North 74 deg. West 11 71 perches then north 38 deg. West 35 perches to a white oak by ye^r 5th Creek then South 43 deg. West 11 71 perches in ye^r Line of ye^r Neals 80 perches to the first mentioned black oak Containing twenty two acres. Walter Faustt his third Lot of fast Land begineth at a black oak by Crum Creek then South 43 deg. Westerly in ye^r Line of Edward Pritchett 37 perches to a white oak by Crum Creek then up ye^r 5th Creek North 38 deg. West 11 20 perches then South 84 deg. West 11 12 perches then north 47 deg. West 11 16 perches then north 23 deg. West 11 29 perches then north 64 deg. Westerly 41 perches to the first mentioned black oak Containing 24 acres & a quarter.
