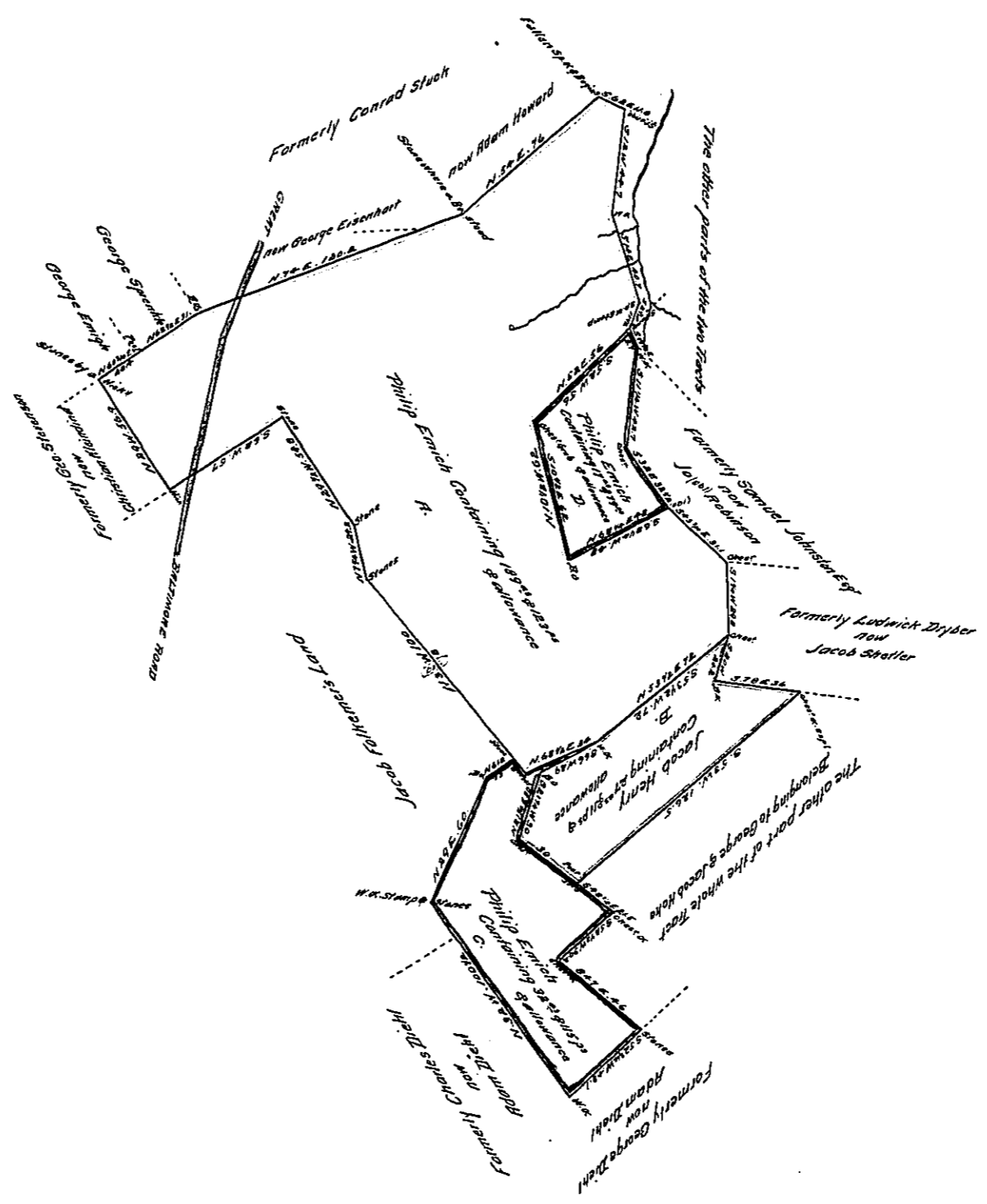

Situate in Codorus Township in the County of York. That Tract included within the Yellow lines where the letter A is placed Containing as above set forth 189th § 123 perches and allowance. Represents part of a larger Tract of Land which was originally Surveyed on the 7th day of April 1767 by William Matthews late D.S. In pursuance of two Warrants one for 60th dated the 21st day of January 1757, the other for 100th dated the 6th day of March 1767, both granted to Philip Emich. That Tract included within the Red lines where the letter B is placed Containing 27th § 114 perches and allowance. Represents part of a larger Tract of 116th § 115 of Land which was originally Surveyed by the said William Matthews late D.S. on the 5th of the 11th Mo. 1764 for Jacob Henry In pursuance of a Warrant for 100th dated the 1st day of October 1762. That Tract included within the Green lines where the letter C is placed Containing 32th § 115 perches and allowance. Represents the Land originally Surveyed by the same on the 24th day of the 5th Mo. 1775. In pursuance of a Warrant for 50th granted to Philip Emich bearing date the 9th day of March 1775. That Tract included within the Blue lines where the letter D is placed Containing 17th § 114 allowance. Represents part of a larger Tract of 66th § 114 allowance, which was originally surveyed on the 24th of the 5th Mo. 1775 by the said William Matthews late D.S. In Pursuance of a Warrant for 50th granted to the said Philip Emich bearing date the 9th day of March 1775. Resurveyed and divided off from the said larger Tracts of Land the 10th & 11th days of November Anno Domini 1809 for the use of the present owner Charles Emich at whose request I am obliged to return the same for Confirmation.
